SPONSORING SHIPMENTS

Over the years ICLD has asked individuals, groups, or churches to "sponsor" a pastor or a village or an area – this shipping cost could be as little as \$46 to \$67 for one box of Christian literature. Some people could afford to pay for a third of a container to Nigeria for about \$3000 (going overseas and distribution in-country), which would cover one of the states of Nigeria, for example, one time. Due to ever-increasing shipping costs ICLD tends to send fewer boxes overseas, the tonnage sent notwithstanding. All monies received contribute to the shipping process – shipping fees, ICLD's building, supplies needed in the process. No person or denomination receives funds or pay or reimbursement of any kind at ICLD. (Volunteers only.) ICLD exists for one, sole purpose -- to send God's Word and Christian literature free-of-charge to developing countries. Thank you for your contributions of funds and materials.

PERSONAL CONVEYANCE

In this day and age people are traveling to everywhere in the world. ICLD exists to send literature overseas and would love to furnish Christian travelers with Bibles and Christian literature to take to their places of destination and to give to the Christian workers in those places they visit in the developing world, especially. Some reading this will be willing to pay for that extra suitcase full of Christian literature. Some may decide to take Christian literature instead of extra clothing and food and gifts normally in tow. Almost everyone willing to make a sacrifice of time and effort could afford to take a few Bibles and books and a few pieces of Sunday School materials. Also, when your foreign friends are visiting – students, businessmen, pastors, missionaries, etc. – please consider bringing them to ICLD to gather a bit of Christian literature to take back to their home country.





We traveled over many muddy, bumpy paths to get to small villages and schools. We forded a stream and walked to a village that did not remember having any white person visit them before. We saw a young girl who had eye problems being able to see an ophthalmologist and have her eyes clear for the first time in many years. Visiting prisons and bringing encouragement in those dark places was also very meaningful to us. We made contacts and helped people connect with one another. We were able to work with several wonderful pastors who have benefited from the books that ICLD has been able to send them thanks to your donations. We saw Malawians who had nothing but were praising the Lord in song and worship. We felt love and gave many hugs to those we met. We left part of our heart in Malawi.
